

UNDERSTANDING YOUR DEGREE AUDIT /PROGRAM EVALUATION.....2007

Degree audits, also called program evaluations may be accessed via WebAdvisor once you have a WebAdvisor ID and Password. You will be able to use these to access your program evaluation and other features of WebAdvisor. You will be entering under the 2007 catalog. Revisions to go with the 2007 catalog will be entered during the summer and fall 2007. While significant changes are not expected, it is advised that you check your program evaluation for updates during the fall term.

At present, your program evaluation reflects whatever program you indicated on your application or updated prior to registration. Program Evaluations may be customized with additional majors and minors, endorsements and certificates. Program evaluations are essential when planning registrations for future terms as they show what requirements are still needed. It is also important to check it after registering to make sure the courses you have registered for will apply where expected.

Attached is an annotated program evaluation to help you identify key elements of the document. If you need help understanding the program evaluation, be sure to ask at Freshman Registration or contact the Registrar's Office at 626-2012 or schedule an appointment during the school year. Your academic advisor may also be able to help you with this document.

REGISTRATION HINTS

1. Students who place in pre general education courses (ENGL 033, MATH 021, MATH 101, READ 041, MIS 105) should take them during their first year. This is important for Proficiency Exam Prep and general academic preparedness. In addition, 0 level courses only count toward athletic eligibility if taken the first year. The tuition rate is slightly higher for 0 level courses to cover the individualized help that is part of these courses. Failure to complete these courses in your first 42 attempted credits will result in registration restrictions and loss of financial aid.
2. To be prepared for Proficiency exams, you should complete the Proficiency Course Requirements in your first year (30 credits). Baccalaureate degree students take the exam the first term after they have completed 48 credits. Associate degree students take the exam the first term after they have completed 32 credits.
3. Please make sure to follow prerequisite requirements. You will not be able to override prerequisites when registering via WebAdvisor.

***NOTE* Business majors**, who are required to take MIS 205, should take the MIS placement, even if have this met by high school coursework to see if they have strong enough background to take MIS 205 without first taking MIS 105. These courses should be done within the first 30 attempted credits or registration restrictions will be placed. Any time a course MIGHT have been used to fulfill a requirement but was not, you will see a note like this. Notes are explained at the end of the audit. Reasons why a course would not be used include failing grade, used already in the requirement type, or no credit on the course.

PR, which does not appear on this sample, means pre-registered. If a degree audit is run after you pre-register, you will be able to see where the courses apply. This is a good check to assure the courses selected actually meet the intended requirements.
