7. Explanation of the Change:

Northern State University is revising the Theatre Program to have three emphases—Theatre Studies, Musical Theatre, and Design—to address weaknesses identified through surveys of graduates of the program. The Musical Theatre major was too narrow and too deep for graduates interested in theatre design, production, and management. By reducing the total number of credits from 62 to 43, Theatre majors at Northern State University have space in their curriculum to add existing minors in Public Relations, Business, Accounting, Communications Studies, or Music or a certificate in Arts Administration. Graduates will be able to combine their Theatre degrees with second majors, minors, or certificates to best suit their career goals.

Northern State University is changing the name of the major from Musical Theatre to Theatre to reflect the revised learning outcomes of the program, which align with the Association for Theatre in Higher Education (https://cdn.ymaws.com/www.athe.org/resource/resmgr/imported/OutcomesAssessment.pdf).

- 1) Knowledge: The University's revised curriculum ensures students learn the various means (acting, directing, designing, constructing, playwriting, etc.) through which a theatrical concept is realized; knowledge of theatre history, and knowledge of various critical theories, research sources, and methodologies.
- 2) Skills: The University's revised curriculum exposes students to the skills needed to effectively use theatre technology and the ability to reach an audience through more than one form of theatrical art.
- 3) Attitudes: The revised curriculum enables the department to offer a 4-year rotation of classes that will bring students through the program in a tighter group and clearer progress through core courses. Faculty will better be able to track and stoke students' development of attitudes, including creative imagination, inquiring mind, social responsibility, collaborative attitude, artistic judgement, and respect for the art form.
